

Building houses for returnees.

Since the war crisis erupted in December 2013, a vast number of South Sudanese left South Sudan and ran to the neighboring countries seeking for safety and many homes, schools and medical facilities were burned and destroyed during the war but now by the grace of God some of the South Sudanese have come back to their homes but some support is required for them to start life and The Great Commission's goal is to 'ensure that crisis-affected people can sustainably live in secure, safe, and dignified conditions by facilitating their access to adequate shelter and basic household items by implement emergency airlift operations to deliver lifesaving survival kits. The lightweight, portable kits may include mosquito nets, seeds, fishing supplies, water carrying containers, water purification tablets, oral rehydration salts, nutritional biscuits, carpets and kitchen accessories.

Food security in South Sudan.

Food security is essential and is urgently needed in south Sudan to avoid depending on imported foods from Uganda and this could be done through promoting Agriculture development and this will make the difference because everyone deserves to have food to eat especially children deserve to grow up in a healthy and safe environment where they can focus on their education and being children instead of having to worry about what they will eat next,"

Food crisis face girls with multiple risks especially adolescent girls of working age face higher barriers to accessing livelihood opportunities and lifesaving and protective services. In times of crisis and food shortage, girls are more likely to see their education cut short and be forced into situations of child marriage, or sexual exploitation and abuse and prostitution.

Medical Outreach in South Sudan.

Most South Sudanese especially the returnees from the exile lack access to essential health services and one in every ten children dies at birth and before they turn five, and the rate of mothers who pass away from pregnancy complications is very high there situations where women give birth on the floor, cutting the umbilical cord of children with sticks.

Poor access to health services and a limited number of health workers and lack of access to health services have produced some of the worst health conditions in South Sudan and around 75 percent of all children deaths in South Sudan are due to preventable diseases, such as diarrhea, malaria and pneumonia, so quick positive response is needed.

The Great Commission is helping in improving through medical outreach by educating community health workers to bring services to people and we believe this will greatly increase access to health services and increase resilience by providing essential drugs, wheelchairs for the disable and medical equipment's to support the treatment of diseases and this can be done through immunization, awareness campaigns this way lives will be protected from preventable and life-threatening diseases.

Support Orphans and widows.

**Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.
James 1:27.**

The Great Commission is committed in restoring hope to Orphans and widows in South Sudan, the wars left the country with many Orphans and widows with trauma of the past, every day in South Sudan there are children who are homeless, no education, they cry for parents who are not alive, wants to eat like any other child but can't this Orphans are waiting to belong.

Widows and orphans can be vulnerable in countless ways, all of which are related to experiencing an incomplete family structure and this susceptibility can be worsened by poor living conditions and infrastructure, inadequate social support, and cultural stigmas.

The loss of a father can be traumatic to both widows and orphans and the results could be grief, loneliness, and financial stress can lead to mental health disorders such as post-traumatic stress syndrome, anxiety, depression, substance abuse, personality disorders and those orphans, or children who have lost both parents, can be left to raise themselves increasing the risk of disorder and making them bitter, hostile and even disobedient to God.

Mostly single mothers may struggle to juggle earning responsibilities and less bonding time. Girls may be married off prematurely to relieve financial and caregiving burdens and the orphans may be forced into child labor and as a result, these children mostly do miss out on the education that could otherwise have lifted them out of the situation..

To us the followers of Christ, it is mandatory for us to protect and support each widow and orphan.

Christians must make a point of actively supporting them. Psalm 82:3 instructs us to “defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and oppressed.”

I believe we can be of help by praying for them, by feeding them, clothing the naked, housing them, sending them to school and many more.

Repatriation Programs.

The initiative to concern repatriation program is because we desire to see our people come back to take back what the enemy has taken from them, restore, rebuild and recover their place in South Sudan and we have seen that some of them have managed to come back home but some of them are interested in coming back home but their biggest obstacle or challenge is the question "how can we make it home? though they are interested in coming home and that is why they are asking for help to come home so that their passion to bring their families, children who grew up in the exile and those ones who were born in the exile can come back home and this is exactly where The Great Commission comes in and needs to support and facilitate the return of those South Sudanese from the exile back to their country.

Peace and Reconciliation.
